THIS CAUSE came before the Board of Chiropractic Medicine (Board) pursuant to section 120.569 and section 120.57(1), Florida Statutes, at a duly-noticed public meeting on December 8, 2000, in Orlando, Florida for the purpose of considering the Administrative Law Judge's Recommended Order (attached hereto as Exhibit A). Petitioner was not and Respondent was represented by attorney Cherry A. Shaw.

Upon review and consideration of the Recommended Order and after a review of the available record in this case, the Board arrived at the following findings of fact and conclusions of law:

# FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The findings of fact set forth in the Recommended Order are approved, adopted, and incorporated herein by reference.
- 2. The material findings of fact are supported by competent, substantial evidence in the record.

### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

- 3. The Board has jurisdiction of this matter pursuant to sections 120.569 and 120.57(1), and chapter 460, Florida Statutes.
- 4. The conclusions of law set forth in the Recommended Order are consistent with the findings and are approved, adopted, and incorporated herein by reference.

#### RECOMMENDATION

5. The Administrative Law Judge's Recommendation is hereby approved and adopted.

#### WHEREFORE,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that Petitioner's examination challenge is rejected. Petitioner failed to achieve a passing score on the November 1999 chiropractic licensure examination and is not eligible for licensure in the State of Florida.

This Final Order shall take effect upon being filed with the Clerk of the Department of Health.
