## FINAL ORDER

THIS CAUSE coming on to be heard before THE SCHOOL BOARD OF BROWARD COUNTY, FLORIDA (hereafter referred to as "THE SCHOOL BOARD") at its meeting conducted on July 17, 2001, to consider (1) the Recommended Order, rendered on March 30, 2001, by Susan B. Kirkland, Administrative Law Judge of The State of Florida Division of Administrative Hearings, consisting of Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Recommendation, recommending that The School Board enter a final order finding that just cause exists for suspending Thomas Jenkins, finding that Thomas Jenkins is guilty of immorality and misconduct in office, and suspending Thomas Jenkins for 60 days; and (2) the Petitioner's Exceptions to the Recommended Order. THE SCHOOL BOARD having considered the record, and being fully advised in the Premises:

IT IS THEREUPON Ordered and Adjudged as Follows:

1. Based upon the substantial competent evidence within the record, The School Board accepts the following portions of the Recommended Order: (1) The appearances, (2) the

Statement of the Issues, (3) Preliminary Statement, (4) Findings of Fact, and (5) Conclusions of Law in their entirety.

- 2. Petitioner's Exceptions to the Recommended Order, numbered One through Five, are rejected, as the Conclusions of Law contained in the Recommended Order are supported by competent legal authority.
- 3. The School Board rejects Petitioner's Exception Number Six in part and amends the Recommendation of the Recommendation to read as follows:
  - (A) The School Board finds that just cause exists for suspending Thomas Jenkins, finding that Thomas Jenkins is guilty of immorality and misconduct in office and suspends Thomas Jenkins for sixty (60) days;
  - (B) Thomas Jenkins shall participate in sensitivity training;
  - (C) Thomas Jenkins shall participate in interpersonal relationship programs in order to develop his capacity to tolerate others' viewpoints as well as decrease his frustration.
  - (D) Thomas Jenkins shall participate in a stress reduction program in order to improve his ability to control frustration and develop more patience;
  - (E) Thomas Jenkins shall successfully complete the above programs and thereafter undergo a successful psychological evaluation by a doctor selected by the Superintendent; and that
  - (F) upon the one year anniversary of the aforementioned successful psychological evaluation, Thomas Jenkins shall undergo a successful psychological exam.
