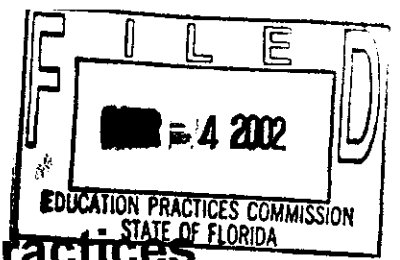

## Final Order

This matter was heard by a Teacher Panel of the Education Practices Commission (EPC) pursuant to Sections 231.261(8) and 120.57(1), Florida Statutes, on November 2, 2001, in Tampa, Florida, for consideration of the Recommended Order entered in this case by Claude B. Arrington, Administrative Law Judge, dated September 6, 2001.

A review of the Recommended Order revealed that on page 14, the Administrative Law Judge recommended that the EPC enter a Final Order "revoking Respondent's teaching certificate" without specifying a recommended duration of such revocation.

Section 231.2615(1), Florida Statutes authorizes the EPC to revoke a certificate for a period not exceeding ten years or to permanently revoke such certificate..

Therefore this matter was remanded to the Administrative Law Judge for clarification of the duration of the recommended revocation.


By his *Amended Recommended Order Following Order of Remand*, dated December 20, 2001, the Administrative Law Judge made it clear that he recommended permanent revocation of Respondent's Florida educator's certificate.

This matter was heard by a Teacher Panel of the Education Practices Commission pursuant to Sections 231.261(8) and 120.57(1), Florida Statutes, on

February 22, 2002, in Tampa, Florida, for consideration of the Amended Recommended Order. After reviewing the complete record accompanying the Amended Recommended Order, and being otherwise fully advised in the premises, the Panel hereby adopts the findings of fact, conclusions of law and recommendation contained in the Amended Recommended Order, and said Amended Recommended Order, a copy of which is attached and made a part hereof, is hereby adopted in full and becomes the Final Order of the Education Practices Commission and Respondent's Florida Educator's Certificate is hereby PERMANENTLY REVOKED.

This Order takes effect upon filing with the Clerk of the Education Practices Commission.

THE NOTICE OF APPEAL MUST BE FILED WITHIN THIRTY (30) DAYS OF RENDITION OF THIS ORDER
