FINAL ORDER

The Director of the Division of Florida Land Sales, Condominiums, and Mobile Homes (Division) enters this Final Order in the above referenced matter.

PRELIMINARY STATEMENT

1. On February 11, 2004, the Division issued a Notice of Intent to Deny
License Application based upon the Division's conclusion that the Respondent, Luis A.
Taboada, Jr. (Taboada) lacked good moral character. The Division reached this
conclusion because Taboada had pled nolo contendere to a felony and Taboada had
not provided an accurate and complete disclosure regarding his criminal history on the
Department of Business and Professional Regulation,

application. The Notice advised Taboada of his right to request a formal hearing or an informal proceeding pursuant to chapter 120, Florida Statutes.

- 2. The procedural history of the proceedings before the Division of Administrative Hearings (DOAH) are set out by the Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) in the Recommended Order, which is incorporated in this Final Order.
- 3. On July 14, 2004, the ALJ entered a Recommended Order finding that Taboada's plea of nolo contendere to felonies and his failure to provide full and complete disclosure bears on Taboada's moral character pursuant to rules 61B-60.003(3)(a)1 and 61B-60.003(3)(a)6, Florida Administrative Code.
 - 4. Neither party filed exceptions to the Recommended Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

5. The Division adopts and incorporates by reference the Findings of Fact numbered 1 through 12 as set forth in the Recommended Order.


CONCLUSIONS OF LAW
