FINAL ORDER

THIS CAUSE came to be heard on this 11th day of August, 2005, before the School Board of Lee County, Florida, and said School Board finds as follows:

- 1. The Respondent is employed by the School Board of Lee County as a bus operator, which is an "educational support employee" classification, as defined by Section 1012.40(1)(a), Florida Statutes. Additionally, the terms and conditions of the Respondent's employment are covered by a collective bargaining agreement between the School Board and the Support Personnel Association of Lee County.
- 2. On or about September 20, 2004, Louis Karnbach, Director of Transportation, notified the Human Resources Division that the Respondent had been arrested for allegedly stealing a computer from a Wal-Mart store. Following her arrest, the Respondent was charged by the State of Florida with

felony larceny. As of the date of this Final Order, the criminal charges against the Respondent are pending.

- 3. Based upon the allegation, the Respondent was suspended with pay and benefits on September 28, 2004, pending an investigation to be conducted by the School District, pursuant to Sections 1012.22(1)(f) and 1012.40(2)(c), Florida Statutes.
- 4. On October 12, 2004, an Investigative Summary was completed detailing the information obtained by the School District during its investigation
- 5. On October 19, 2004, a predetermination conference was held with the Respondent and her attorney. The Respondent was advised that the purpose of the conference was to give her the opportunity to address the allegations and the information obtained by the District during its investigation.
- 6. On or about October 21, 2004, the Respondent was notified that the School District determined probable cause existed to impose discipline. The Respondent was also advised that a recommendation would be made to the Superintendent that she be terminated.
- 7. The Respondent, through her attorney, requested an administrative hearing on the Petition, pursuant to School Board Policy 1.80 and Section 7.093 of the SPALC Agreement.

- 8. On December 16, 2004, the School Board suspended the Respondent without pay and benefits, pending the outcome of administrative hearing requested by the Respondent.
- 9. An administrative hearing on the Petition was held on March 8, 2005, before Lawrence P. Stevenson, Administrative Law Judge (ALJ).
- 10. On July 15, 2005, the ALJ issued a Recommended Order, in which he recommended that the School Board enter a final order dismissing the Petition for Termination of Employment, and reinstate the Respondent to her former position, with back pay and benefits.
- 11. No exceptions to the Recommended Order have been filed by the parties; therefore the Recommended Order has been incorporated into this Final Order by reference.

IT IS ACCORDINGLY ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:

The Petition for Termination is dismissed. The Respondent shall be reinstated to her former position, effective August 8, 2005, with back pay and benefits retroactive to December 16, 2004.

This Final Order may be appealed to the District Court of Appeal of Florida, Second District, P.O. Box 327, 1005 E. Memorial Boulevard, Lakeland, Florida 33802, telephone number (863) 499-2290. The appeal must be filed within thirty (30)

days of the date of this Order by filing a Notice of Appeal with the School Board and a second copy with the District Court of Appeals. For further information, contact Jason L.
