# FINAL ORDER DISMISSING PETITIONS FOR RELIEF FROM AN UNLAWFUL EMPLOYMENT PRACTICE

#### Preliminary Matters

Petitioners Jasen Baker and Bernard Southwell filed complaints of discrimination pursuant to the Florida Civil Rights Act of 1992, Sections 760.01 - 760.11, <u>Florida Statutes</u> (2001), alleging that Respondent Carrabba's Italian Grill committed unlawful employment practices on the basis of Petitioners' sex by subjecting Petitioners to sexual harassment, and by unlawfully retaliating against Petitioners.

The allegations set forth in the complaints were investigated, and, on January 19, 2005, the Executive Director issued his determination with regard to Bernard Southwell finding that there was reasonable cause to believe that an unlawful employment practice had occurred. On January 26, 2005, the Executive Director issued his determination with regard to Jasen Baker finding that there was no reasonable cause to believe that an unlawful employment practice had occurred.

Petitioners filed Petitions for Relief from an Unlawful Employment Practice, and the cases were transmitted to the Division of Administrative Hearings for the conduct of a formal proceeding. The Division of Administrative Hearings consolidated the cases, and an evidentiary hearing was held in Orlando, Florida, on July 27, 2005, before Administrative Law Judge Daniel M. Kilbride.

Judge Kilbride issued a Recommended Order of dismissal, dated November 10, 2005.

The Commission panel designated below considered the records of these matters and determined the action to be taken on the Recommended Order.

### Findings of Fact

We find the Administrative Law Judge's findings of fact to be supported by competent substantial evidence.

We adopt the Administrative Law Judge's findings of fact.

### Conclusions of Law

We find the Administrative Law Judge's application of the law to the facts to result in a correct disposition of the matter.

We adopt the Administrative Law Judge's conclusions of law.

# **Exceptions**

None of the parties filed exceptions to the Administrative Law Judge's Recommended Order.

#### **Dismissal**

The Petitions for Relief and Complaints of Discrimination are DISMISSED with prejudice.

The parties have the right to seek judicial review of this Order. The Commission and the appropriate District Court of Appeal must receive notice of appeal within 30 days of the date this Order is filed with the Clerk of the Commission. Explanation of the right to appeal is found in Section 120.68, <u>Florida Statutes</u>, and in the Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure 9.110.
