## **FINAL ORDER**

THIS CAUSE came before FLORIDA REAL ESTATE APPRAISAL BOARD (Board) pursuant to Sections 120.569 and 120.57(1), Florida Statutes, on August 7, 2006, in Orlando, Florida, for the purpose of considering Administrative Law Judge Florence Snyder Rivas' Recommended Order, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A, in the above-styled cause. Petitioner Rafael Oropesa (hereafter "Petitioner") and his Counsel John R. Sutton, Esq., were not present at the Board meeting. Respondent Florida Real Estate Appraisal Board (hereafter "Respondent") was represented by Assistant Attorney General Brian J. Stabley who was present at the Board meeting. The parties did not file exceptions to the Administrative Law Judge's Recommended Order. At this proceeding, the Board was represented by DBPR, Division of Real Estate Chief Prosecuting Attorney James Harwood.

After a review of the complete record in this matter, including consideration of the Administrative Law Judge's Recommended Order and the arguments of each party, the Board makes the following findings and conclusions:

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The Administrative Law Judge's findings of fact as set forth in the Recommended Order are approved, adopted, and incorporated herein by reference.



2. There is competent, substantial evidence to support the Administrative Law Judge's findings of fact as adopted by the Board.

# **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

- 3. The Board has jurisdiction of this matter pursuant to Sections 120.569 and 120.57(1), Florida Statutes, Chapter 475, Part II of the Florida Statutes, and Chapter 61J1 of the Florida Administrative Code.
- 4. The Administrative Law Judge's conclusions of law are approved, adopted, and incorporated herein by reference.
- 5. There is competent, substantial evidence to support the Administrative Law Judge's conclusions of law as adopted by the Board.

# RECOMMENDATION

6. The Administrative Law Judge's recommendation is approved and adopted by the Board in its entirety.

WHEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that:

Petitioner Rafael Oropesa's application for licensure as a Florida registered trainee real estate appraiser is **DENIED**.
