## Findings of Fact

- 1. The Administrative Law Judge's findings of fact as set forth in the Exhibit "A" are approved, adopted, and incorporated herein by reference.
- 2. There is competent, substantial evidence to support the Administrative Law Judge's findings of fact as adopted by the Commission.

## Conclusions of Law

- 3. The Board has jurisdiction of this matter pursuant to Sections 120.569 and 120.57(1), Florida Statutes, Chapter 475, Part I, Florida Statutes, and Chapter 61J2 of the Florida Administrative Code.
- 4. The Administrative Law Judge's conclusions of law as set forth in Exhibit "A" are approved, adopted, and incorporated herein by reference.
- 5. There is competent, substantial evidence to support the Administrative Law Judge's conclusions of law in Exhibit "A" as amended and adopted by the Commission.

#### DISPOSITION

6. The Administrative Law Judge's Recommendation is approved and adopted by the Commission in its entirety.

WHEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED and ADJUDGED that:

Petitioner's application for licensure as a real estate

broker is hereby DENIED. This Final Order shall take effect

upon being filed with the Clerk of the Department of

Business and Professional Regulation.

Review proceedings are governed by the Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure. Such proceedings are commenced by filing one copy of a Notice of Appeal with the agency clerk of the Department of Business and Professional Regulation and a second copy, accompanied by filing fees prescribed by law, with the district court of appeal in the appellate district where the party resides.

The Notice of Appeal must be filed within thirty (30) days of rendition of the order to be reviewed.
