FINAL ORDER

THIS CAUSE came on for consideration of and final agency action on the Recommended Order rendered on May 16, 2007. On November 27, 2006, the Department of Financial Services issued an Administrative Complaint against Respondent, alleging that Respondent had violated Subsections 626.611(7), (9), (11), and (14) and Subsection 626.621(3), Florida Statutes (2006).

The Respondent replied in writing to the allegations of the Administrative Complaint, and timely requested a formal hearing pursuant to Section 120.57(1), Florida Statutes. Pursuant to notice the matter was heard before Administrative Law Judge Lawrence P. Stevenson of the Division of Administrative Hearings on March 19, 2007, by video teleconference at sites in Tallahassee and Orlando, Florida.

After consideration of the evidence, argument, and testimony presented at the hearing, the Administrative Law Judge issued his Recommended Order on May 16, 2007. A true and correct copy of the Recommended Order is attached hereto as Exhibit "A". In his Recommended Order the ALJ concluded that the Department of Financial Services should enter a final order finding Respondent guilty of violating Subsections

626.611(7) and (14), Florida Statutes (2006) as alleged in Count I of the Administrative Complaint, by pleading nolo contendere to a felony involving fraud with respect to an insurance application. The ALJ recommended that the Department issue a final order revoking the Respondent's licenses and eligibility for licensure. No exceptions were filed by either party.

Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law set forth in the Recommended Order are adopted as the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law of the Department of Financial Services in this matter.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Respondent, COURTNEY PRINCE WALKER's, license(s) and eligibility for licensure as an general lines agent are hereby REVOKED, effective immediately upon issuance of this Final Order. Pursuant to Section 626.651, Florida Statutes, the revocation of the Respondent's license(s) and eligibility for licensure is applicable to all licenses and eligibility held by Respondent under the Florida Insurance Code.

Pursuant to Section 626.641(4), Florida Statutes, the Respondent shall not engage in or attempt or profess to engage in any transaction or business for which a license or appointment is required under the Insurance Code, or directly or indirectly own, control, or be employed in any manner by any insurance agent or agency or adjuster or adjusting firm, during the period of revocation.
