FINAL ORDER

THIS MATTER came before the Florida Real Estate Appraisal Board (hereinafter "the Board") for consideration of the recommended order entered in the above-styled matter pursuant to Sections 120.569 and 120.57, Florida Statutes.

On August 9, 2006, Petitioner filed an administrative complaint against Respondent's license. The Respondent timely requested an evidentiary hearing before Division of Administrative Hearings (DOAH) and these matters were transferred to DOAH. On July 16, 2007, an administrative hearing was held before the Honorable Daniel Manry, Administrative Law Judge. Judge Adams' Recommended Order in this matter was filed with DOAH on September 14, 2007. There were no exceptions filed by either party. Based on its consideration of the entire record, the Board makes the following findings of facts and conclusions of law:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- The Board hereby adopts the finding of facts contained in paragraphs one
 through five (5) of the Recommended Order as the Board's findings of facts.
- 2. There is competent substantial evidence to support the Board's findings of facts.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Board hereby adopts the conclusions of law contained in paragraphs six (6) through fourteen (14) of the Recommended Order as the Board's conclusions of law.
- 2. There is competent substantial evidence to support the Board's conclusions of law.

<u>ORDER</u>

The Board hereby adopts the Hearing Officer's Recommendation as the Board's decision on the Petitioner's applications.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- The Respondent is found guilty of the charges alleged in the Administrative Complaint;
- 2. The Respondent is ordered to pay \$3,492.10 in investigative and administrative costs to the Petitioner within 30 days of the date of the entry of this final order; and
- 3. The Respondent's residential appraiser (RD 5451) license is hereby revoked.

This Final Order shall become effective upon filing with the Clerk of the Department.
