CONSENT FINAL ORDER

The Respondent, Juan-Carlos "J.C." Planas, and the Florida Elections Commission (Commission) agree that this Consent Order resolves all of the issues between the parties in this case. The parties jointly stipulate to the following facts, conclusions of law, and order:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. On June 11, 2009, the staff of the Commission issued a Staff Recommendation, recommending to the Commission that there was probable cause to believe that The Florida Election Code was violated.
- 2. On September 1, 2009, the Commission entered an Order of Probable Cause finding that there was probable cause to charge the Respondent with the following violations:

Count 1:

Respondent violated Section 106.07(2)(b)1., Florida Statutes, when the Respondent failed to file with the candidate's filing officer an addendum to the candidate's 2008 Q1 incomplete campaign report due on April 10, 2008, after receiving notice from the filing officer.

- 3. On September 3, 2009, the Respondent was served by certified mail with a copy of the Order of Probable Cause.
 - 4. The Respondent and the staff stipulate to the following facts:

Consent Order at its next available meeting.

- 10. The Respondent voluntarily waives the right to any further proceedings under Chapters 104, 106, and 120, Florida Statutes, and the right to appeal the Consent Order.
- 11. This Consent Order is enforceable under Sections 106.265 and 120.69, Florida Statutes. The Respondent expressly waives any venue privileges and agrees that if enforcement of this Consent Order is necessary, venue shall be in Leon County, Florida, and Respondent shall be responsible for all fees and costs associated with enforcement.
- 12. If the Commission does not receive the signed Consent Order within 20 days of the date Respondent receives this order, the staff withdraws this offer of settlement and will proceed with the case.
- 13. Payment of the civil penalty is a condition precedent to the Commission's consideration of the Consent Order.

PENALTY

WHEREFORE, based upon the foregoing facts and conclusions of law, the Commission finds that the Respondent has violated Section 106.07(2)(b)1., Florida Statutes, and imposes a fine of \$500 for the violation.

Therefore it is

ORDERED that the Respondent shall remit to the Commission a civil penalty in the amount of \$500 inclusive of fees and costs. The civil penalty shall be paid to the Florida Elections Commission, 107 W. Gaines Street, Collins Building, Suite 224, Tallahassee, Florida, 32399-1050.

The Respondent hereby agrees and consents to the terms of this Order on . 2009.

- a. The Respondent was a candidate for the Florida House of Representatives-District 115 in the 2008 election.
- b. Section 106.07(2)(b)1., Florida Statutes, requires a candidate to file an addendum to an incomplete campaign report within three days after receiving notice from the filing officer.
- c. Respondent filed his 2008 Q1 campaign treasurer's report listing campaign contributions and expenditures between January 1, 2008 and March 31, 2008 on April 11, 2008. The report was incomplete, and the filing officer requested the Respondent to file an addendum to his report
- d. Respondent did not file an addendum to his 2008 Q1 report within three days.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 5. The Commission has jurisdiction over the parties to and subject matter of this cause, pursuant to Section 106.26, Florida Statutes.
- 6. The Commission staff and the Respondent stipulate that all elements of the offense charged in the Order of Probable Cause can be proven by clear and convincing evidence

ORDER

- 7. The Respondent and the staff of the Commission have entered into this Consent Order voluntarily and upon advice of counsel.
- 8. The Respondent shall bear his own attorney fees and costs that are in any way associated with this case.
- 9. The Respondent understands that before the Consent Order becomes final agency action, the Commission must approve it at a public meeting. The Commission will consider the
