After review of the record, including the transcript of proceedings and admitted exhibits, and being otherwise fully apprised in all material premises,



IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the Amended Order Assessing Penalty for Working in Violation of Reinstated Stop-Work Order is affirmed, and that J.D. Tree Service, Inc., shall pay to the Department the assessed penalty of \$381,000.00, within thirty (30) days from the date hereof.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that J.D. Tree Service, Inc., shall cease all business operations unless and until it provides evidence satisfactory to the Division of Workers' Compensation of having now complied with the workers' compensation law by securing the necessary workers' compensation insurance coverage for covered

employees and, pursuant to Section 440.107(7)(a), Florida Statutes, paying the civil penalty imposed herein.
