CONCLUSIONS OF LAW


The agency hereby adopts the conclusions of law, *in haec verba*, as the conclusions of law of the agency by reference and adoption.

Notice of Appeal Rights

Pursuant to Section 120.68, Fla. Stat., a party to this Final Order may seek judicial review of this Final Order in the appropriate district court of appeal by filing a notice of appeal pursuant to Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure 9.110(c). The original notice of appeal shall be filed with Superintendent of Schools as Secretary to the School Board on or before 30 days from the date of this final order. A copy of the notice, together with the appropriate filing fee, shall also be filed with the Clerk, District Court of Appeal, Second District, Lakeland, Florida. If the 30th day following the date of the filing of this order with the Superintendent of Schools falls on a Saturday, Sunday or a day when the school board office is otherwise closed, the notice of appeal must be filed on the next day that the school board office is open for business. If a party to this proceeding fails to file a notice of appeal within the time prescribed by law and the rules of court, the party will lose its right to appeal this final order.
