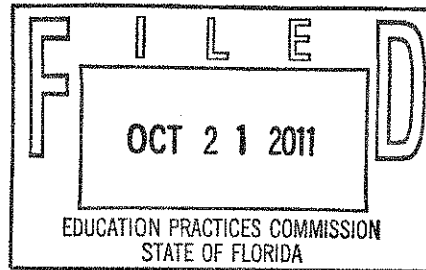

Final Order

Respondent, Bryan Mays, holds Florida educator's certificate no. 636531. This cause came before a teacher panel of the Education Practices Commission on September 22, 2011, in Tampa, Florida pursuant to Sections 1012.795, 1012.796 and 120.57(1), Florida Statutes, for consideration of the Recommended Order entered in this case by Edward T. Bauer, Administrative Law Judge dated June 28, 2011. Respondent was not present.

After reviewing the complete record accompanying the Recommended Order, the Recommended Order, and being fully advised in the premises, the Commission hereby adopts the findings of fact, (paragraphs 1-14), conclusions of law, (paragraphs 15-38), and the recommendation contained in the Recommended Order. SUCH PROCEEDINGS ARE COMMENCED BY FILING ONE COPY OF A NOTICE OF APPEAL WITH THE EDUCATION PRACTICES COMMISSION AND A SECOND COPY, ACCOMPANIED BY FILING FEES PRESCRIBED BY LAW, WITH THE DISTRICT COURT OF APPEAL, FIRST DISTRICT, OR WITH THE DISTRICT COURT OF APPEAL IN THE APPELLATE DISTRICT WHERE THE PARTY RESIDES. THE NOTICE OF APPEAL MUST BE FILED WITHIN THIRTY (30) DAYS OF RENDITION OF THIS ORDER.


