## FINAL ORDER

Findings of Fact

1. The Administrative Law Judge's findings of fact as set forth in the Exhibit "A" are approved, adopted, and incorporated herein by reference.
2. There is competent, substantial evidence to support the Administrative Law Judge's findings of fact as adopted by the Commission.

## Conclusions of Law

3. The Commission has jurisdiction of this matter pursuant to Sections 120.569 and $120.57(1)$, Florida Statutes, Chapter 475, Part I, Florida Statutes, and Chapter 61 J 2 of the Florida Administrative Code.
4. The Administrative Law Judge's conclusions of law as set forth in Exhibit "A" are approved, adopted, and incorporated herein by reference.
5. There is competent, substantial evidence to support the Administrative Law Judge's conclusions of law in Exhibit "A" adopted by the Commission.

## DISPOSITION

6. The Administrative Law Judge's Recommendation is approved and adopted by the Commission.

WHEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED and ADJUDGED that:

Petitioner's application for licensure as a real estate sales associate is hereby DENIED. This Final Order shall
take effect upon being filed with the clerk of the

Department of Business and Professional Regulation.

## NOTICE OF RIGHT TO JUDICIAL REVIEW
