# ORDER REMANDING CASE TO ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE FOR RE-ISSUANCE OF RECOMMENDED ORDER

This matter is before the Commission for consideration of the Recommended Order, dated September 18, 2012, issued in the above-styled matter by Administrative Law Judge James H. Peterson, III.

# Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law

The Recommended Order reflects that it was sent to Petitioner at 4344 Langley Avenue, Apartment 121-D, Pensacola, FL 32504. Petitioner's Proposed Recommended Order, filed with the Division of Administrative Hearings on August 13, 2012, prior to the issuance of the Recommended Order, states that Petitioner has relocated and that Petitioner's address is 11237 Genova Terrace, Hampton, GA 30228. We are concerned that Petitioner may not have received a copy of the Recommended Order, thereby impacting Petitioner's ability to file exceptions to the Recommended Order should Petitioner desire to do so.

Consequently, we remand the matter to the Administrative Law Judge for the re-issuance of the Recommended Order, using the address for Petitioner set out in Petitioner's Proposed Recommended Order, starting anew Petitioner's time for filing exceptions. Accord, <u>Jackson v. Dollar General Corporation</u>, FCHR Order No. 09-022 (March 6, 2009), <u>Van Sandt-Fuller v. Coastal Cosmetic Center, Inc.</u>, FCHR Order No. 06-051 (May 24, 2006), and <u>Francis v. Department of Juvenile Justice</u>, FCHR Order No. 06-094 (November 13, 2006). (We note that in both <u>Van Sandt-Fuller</u> and <u>Francis</u>, supra, which were remanded to the respective Administrative Law Judges for the same reason as this case, the Administrative Law Judges, upon reviewing the computer mail-out system of the Division of Administrative Hearings, subsequently found that the Recommended Orders had been mailed to the correct addresses and that the addresses on the Recommended Orders were typographical errors. The Administrative Law Judges consequently declined the Commission's remand of the cases. See, for <u>Van Sandt-Fuller</u>, "Order Declining Remand" in DOAH Case 05-4057, dated June 5, 2006, and for <u>Francis</u>, "Order Declining Remand" in DOAH Case 05-2958, dated November 20, 2006.)

## **Exceptions**

Neither party filed exceptions to the Administrative Law Judge's Recommended Order.

#### Remand

The Petition for Relief and Complaint of Discrimination are REMANDED to the Administrative Law Judge for the re-issuance of the Recommended Order, as indicated above.
