FINAL ORDER

This matter came before the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission and at a public meeting on November 7, 2013, in Miramar Beach, Florida. It was alleged by Administrative Complaint that the Respondent had violated specified sections of Chapter 943, Florida Statutes, and Chapter 11B-27, Florida Administrative Code. In a Stipulation and Settlement Agreement, which is incorporated herein by reference, the Respondent chose to voluntarily relinquish his criminal justice certification to the Commission.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The terms of the Stipulation and Settlement Agreement between the parties is approved, adopted and incorporated herein by reference, as the Commission's findings in this case.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Commission has jurisdiction over the parties and the subject matter of this case.

2. Under §120.57(4), Florida Statutes, the allegations set forth in the Administrative Complaint may be resolved by stipulation, agreed settlement, or consent order.

It is therefore ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that:

1. The Stipulation and Settlement Agreement between the parties is ADOPTED and the Respondent's voluntary relinquishment of his above referenced criminal justice certification is ACCEPTED.

2. This Final Order will become effective upon filing with the Clerk of the Department of Law Enforcement.
