PUBLIC REPORT AND ORDER DISMISSING COMPLAINT

On Friday, December 12, 2014, the Commission on Ethics met in public session and considered this complaint at the request of its Advocate. After considering the record of the matter, hearing from the Advocate, and hearing from its legal staff, the Commission voted to dismiss the complaint because additional discovery and information obtained by the Advocate led the Advocate to believe that the Respondent did not violate Section 112.313(6), Florida Statutes, by using and/or attempting to use his public position to secure a special privilege, benefit, or exemption for himself or others, as found in the Order Finding Probable Cause entered in this matter.

Accordingly, this complaint is hereby dismissed with the issuance of this public report.
