THIS CAUSE came on for entry of a final order. The Recommended Order finds respondent failed to secure workers' compensation insurance as required by law, and concludes the Department should impose the statutory penalty as calculated by the Department. Neither party filed exceptions to the Recommended Order.

The Recommended Order is adopted in full. Accordingly, Leonard Leonard d/b/a Leo's Touch Hand Car Wash, is assessed a penalty of \$50,505.36 for failure to maintain workers' compensation coverage as alleged in the February 23, 2015, Second Amended Order of Penalty Assessment.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL

A party adversely affected by this final order may seek judicial review as provided in section 120.68, Florida Statutes, and Florida Rule of Appellate Procedure 9.190.
