FINAL ORDER

Respondent, Department of Business and Professional Regulation, Division of Florida Condominiums, Timeshares, and Mobile Homes (hereinafter the "Division"), enters this Final Order adopting the Recommended Order issued by Administrative Law Judge Cathy M. Sellers on July 18, 2016.

On January 6, 2016, the Division issued a Notice of Intent to Deny License Application, alleging that Petitioner's license application should be denied for failure to furnish proof satisfactory to the Division that he is of good moral character pursuant to section 326.004(6)(a), Florida Statutes. Petitioner timely requested a formal hearing to dispute the Division's intent to deny Petitioner's license application for a yacht salesperson's license.

On February 16, 2016, the case was referred to the Division of Administrative Hearings where it was docketed as Case No. 16-0854 and assigned to the Honorable Cathy M. Sellers, Administrative Law Judge (hereinafter the "ALJ").

Pursuant to section 120.57(1), Florida Statutes, a hearing was held on April 27, 2016.

Petitioner was represented by Richard F. Della Fera, Esquire, and the Division by Ryan N.

Lumbreras, Esquire and Robin E. Smith, Esquire. The ALJ entered a Recommended Order,

which is attached and incorporated in this Final Order, recommending that the Division issue a

Final Order approving Petitioner's application for a yacht salesperson license. Neither party

submitted exceptions. Based upon review of the record, the Division adopts the Recommended

Order in total under section 120.57(1)(1), Florida Statutes.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Division hereby adopts and incorporates by reference the Findings of Fact numbered

1 through 27 as set forth in the Recommended Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Division hereby adopts and incorporates by reference the Conclusions of Law

numbered 28 through 39 as set forth in the Recommended Order.

ORDER

Based upon the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, it is hereby

ORDERED that:

1. The Division adopts the ALJ's Recommended Order; and

2. The Division shall approve Petitioner's application for a yacht salesperson's license.

3. This order shall become effective on the date of the filing with the Department's Agency

Clerk.
