FINAL ORDER

THIS CAUSE came before the BOARD OF NURSING (Board) pursuant to Sections 120.569 and 120.57(1), Florida Statutes, at the properly noticed meeting on February 1-3, 2017, in Tampa, Florida, for the purpose of considering the Administrative Law Judge's Recommended Order (a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A) in the above-styled cause. Petitioner was represented by Matthew Witters, Assistant General Counsel. Counsel for Respondent, Paul Drake, Esq. was present on behalf of Respondent.

Upon review of the Recommended Order, the argument of the parties, and after a review of the complete record in this case, the Board makes the following findings and conclusions.

EXCEPTIONS

1. The Department filed exceptions to paragraphs 15, 16, 17, 22, 38, and 39 of the Recommended Order. The Respondent responded to the Department's exceptions.

2. After consideration, the Board finds that the Department's exceptions point to an evidentiary ruling over which the Board has no substantive jurisdiction. Therefore the Department's exceptions are rejected.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 3. The findings of fact set forth in the Recommended Order are approved and adopted and incorporated herein by reference.
- 4. There is competent substantial evidence to support the findings of fact.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 5. The Board has jurisdiction of this matter pursuant to Section 120.57(1), Florida Statutes, and Chapter 464, Florida Statutes.
- 6. The conclusions of law set forth in the Recommended Order are approved and adopted and incorporated herein by reference.

PENALTY

7. Upon a complete review of the record in this case, the Board determines that the recommendation of the Administrative Law Judge that the case be dismissed is ACCEPTED.

WHEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AND ADJUDGED:

The Administrative Complaint filed against Brandon Young is DISMISSED.
