FINAL ORDER

THIS CAUSE is before the Agency for entry of a Final Order concerning Petitioner's request for an exemption from disqualification from holding a position of special trust as provided in chapter 435.07, Florida Statutes. Petitioner seeks an exemption from disqualification so that Petitioner can work in a position having direct contact with developmentally disabled children or people served in programs regulated by the Department of Children and Families or the Agency for Persons with Disabilities. Following an administrative hearing, conducted via video teleconference, before a designated Administrative Law Judge ("ALJ") of the Division of Administrative Hearings ("DOAH"), on June 15, 2017, the Administrative Law Judge issued a Recommended Order concluding that Petitioner did demonstrate sufficient rehabilitation such that he should be considered for exemption. Neither party filed exceptions to the Recommended Order. There being no basis to reject the findings of fact and conclusions of law of the Administrative Law Judge, the Recommended Order is approved and adopted. Accordingly, Petitioner's request for an exemption from disqualification from holding a position of special trust is hereby GRANTED.
