FINAL ORDER

THIS CAUSE is before the State of Florida, Agency for Health Care Administration ("the Agency") concerning the approval of Certificate of Need ("CON") 10483 filed by Next Generation Behavioral Health, LLC ("Next Generation") to establish a new 104-bed adult psychiatric hospital. The Agency comparatively reviewed CON applications for other beds and programs batching cycle with an application due date of March 8, 2017: For the case at hand, the reviews included in relevant part:

Next Generation Behavioral Health, LLC 103-Beds Approved 10484 Southeast Florida Behavioral Health LLC 80-Beds Denied

- On June 6, 2017, the Agency published notice of its intent to approve Next 1. Generation's CON 10483 in the Florida Administrative Register.
- On June 27, 2017, Southern Winds filed a Petition for Formal Administrative 2. Hearing contesting the approval of CON Application No. 10483 filed by Next Generation.
- On July 12, 2017, Southeast Florida Behavioral Health, LLC ("Southeast Florida") 3. (DOAH No. 17-9304, Hialeah Hospital, Inc, d/b/a Hialeah Hospital, Lifemark Hospitals of

Florida, Inc., d/b/a Palmetto General Hospital and North Shore Medical Center, Inc., d/b/a North Shore Medical Center ("Palmetto/North Shore") (DOAH No. 17-3905CON) and Plantation General Hospital Limited Partnership, d/b/a Mercy Hospital, A Campus Of Plantation General Hospital; Kendall Healthcare Group, LTD., d/b/a Kendall Regional Medical Center; and Miami Beach Healthcare Group, LTD., d/b/a Aventura Hospital, et al ("Plantation/Aventura") (DOAH No. 17-3906CON) also filed Petitions for Formal Administrative Hearing.

- 4. The Agency referred the Petitions to the Division of Administrative Hearings ("DOAH") and an Administrative Law Judge ("ALJ") was assigned.
- 5. On July 31, 2017, the ALJ entered an Order Consolidating Case with regard to DOAH Case No. 17-3903CON, 17-3905CON and 17-3906CON.
- 6. On October 16, 2017, Southern Winds filed a Notice of Voluntary Dismissal dismissing its Petition.
- 7. October 16, 2017, the ALJ entered an Order Closing Filing and Relinquishing Jurisdiction as to the above referenced case based upon the filing of the Notice of Voluntary Dismissal by Southern Winds.

It is therefore **ORDERED**:

1. The Petition of Southern Winds is dismissed.
