## SUPPLEMENTAL FINAL ORDER ON REMAND

The First District Court of Appeal remanded the appeal of

this matter with the following opinion:

Since there was no reasonable basis for the [Administrative Law Judge ("ALJ")] to reject appellant's evidence, we find that the ALJ erred as a matter of law in concluding that appellant failed to prove his case by a preponderance of the evidence. Accordingly, we remand the cause to [the Division of Administrative Hearings] for the ALJ to reduce [the Agency for Health Care Administration's] Medicaid lien to \$11,637.54. <u>See Giraldo v.</u> <u>Agency for Health Care Admin.</u>, 248 So. 3d 53, 56 (Fla. 2018).

Larrigui-Negron v. State Ag. for Health Care Admin., 44 Fla. L. Weekly D2521 (Fla. 1st DCA Oct. 11, 2019). The court's mandate, directed to the undersigned, was issued on November 1, 2019.

No further proceedings are necessary or appropriate to carry out the directions from the court. Therefore, as commanded, it is found and concluded that the Agency for Health Care Administration's Medicaid lien should be reduced to \$11,637.54.

Accordingly, based on the foregoing, it is,

ORDERED that:

 The Medicaid lien of the Agency for Health Care Administration against Petitioner/Appellant is reduced to \$11,637.54.
