FINAL ORDER OF DISMISSAL

On February 15, 2019, the Petitioner, Charles Krininger, III, filed an Unopposed Motion to Withdraw Petition for Administrative Hearing ("Unopposed Motion") with the Division of Administrative Hearings ("DOAH"). Petitioner had filed his Petition to challenge the SBA's Notice of Forfeiture of Retirement Benefits, dated October 29, 2018, that advised Petitioner that since he had pled Nolo Contendere to a felony crime that was connected to his public employment, he had violated Section 112.3173, Florida Statutes, that allows for forfeiture of the right to public retirement benefits. In response to the Unopposed Motion, Administrative Law Judge D.R. Alexander entered, on February 18, 2019, an Order Closing File and Relinquishing Jurisdiction back to the SBA, which is attached as Exhibit A. The matter is now pending before the Chief of Defined Contribution Programs for final agency action.

ORDERED

This Final Order of Dismissal is entered dismissing the Petitioner's protest to the forfeiture, based on Petitioner's voluntary withdrawal of his Petition for Hearing that initiated the case.

Any party to this proceeding has the right to seek judicial review of the Final Order pursuant to Section 120.68, Florida Statutes, by the filing of a Notice of Appeal pursuant to Rule 9.110, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure, with the Clerk of the State Board of Administration in the Office of the General Counsel, State Board of Administration, 1801 Hermitage Boulevard, Suite 100, Tallahassee, Florida, 32308, and by filing a copy of the Notice of Appeal accompanied by the applicable filing fees with the appropriate District Court of Appeal. The Notice of Appeal must be filed within thirty (30) days from the date the Final Order is filed with the Clerk of the State Board of Administration.
