FINAL ORDER

THIS CAUSE came before the Board of Nursing (Board) pursuant to Sections 120.569 and 120.57(1), Florida Statutes, by teleconference call on April 2, 2020, for the purpose of considering the Administrative Law Judge's Recommended Order, which is attached hereto as Exhibit A, in the above-styled cause. Petitioner was represented by Matthew J. Witters, Chief Legal Counsel. Respondent was not present but was represented by counsel, Sara A. Bazzigaluppi, Attorney at Law.

Upon review of the Recommended Order and after a review of the complete record in this case, the Board makes the following findings and conclusions.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The findings of fact set forth in the Recommended Order are approved and adopted and incorporated herein by reference.
 - 2. There is competent substantial evidence in the record to support the findings of fact.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 3. The Board has jurisdiction of this matter pursuant to Section 120.57(1), Florida Statutes, and Chapter 464, Florida Statutes.
- 4. The conclusions of law set forth in the Recommended Order are approved and adopted and incorporated herein by reference.

PENALTY

Upon a complete review of the record in this case, the Board ACCEPTS the recommendation of the Administrative Law Judge of: payment of an administrative fine of \$500, payable within 12 months of the filing date of this Final Order; suspension of license until Respondent undergoes an evaluation coordinated through the Intervention Project for Nurses (IPN) and complies with any and all recommendations and contract conditions; and completes eight (8) hours of ethics, two (2) hours of Critical Thinking, and sixteen (16) hours of medication administration continuing education within six (6) months of the filing date of this Final Order. These continuing education hours are in addition to the hours required for license renewal.

The Department filed an uncontested Motion to Assess Costs and the Board agreed to bifurcate costs and retain jurisdiction to impose costs at a later date.

WHEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AND ADJUDGED:

The Board finds that Respondent violated Section 464.018(1)(h), Florida Statutes, by violating rule 64B9-8.005(2), Florida Administrative Code and Section 464.018(1)(i), Florida Statutes; imposes a \$500 fine to be paid within 12 months; suspends Respondent's registered nurse license until she undergoes an evaluation coordinated through IPN and is compliant with all terms and conditions imposed by IPN; and completes 26 hours of additional continuing education as specified above.

This Final Order shall become effective upon filing with the Clerk of the Department of Health.
