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FINAL ORDER

THIS CAUSE is before the State of Florida, Agency for Health Care Administration (the "Agency") concerning the preliminary denial of certificate of need ("CON") Application 10700 submitted by Florida Hospice, Inc., ("Florida Hospice") for a new hospice program in District 9C, Palm Beach County, Florida.

- 1. On August 6, 2021, the Agency announced a fixed need pool for one additional hospice program in Hospice Service Area 9C, Palm Beach County, Florida. See 47 Fla. Admin. Reg. No. 152, p. 3629 (Aug. 6, 2021).
- 2. Multiple applicants filed competing CON applications in response to the announced fixed need pool, each seeking approval to establish a new hospice program in Hospice Service Area 9C. The applicants included Florida Hospice (CON 10701).
- 3. On December 17, 2021, the Agency preliminarily approved CON 10702 filed by Morselife Hospice Institute, Inc., d/b/a Palm Beach Hospice by Morselife ("Morselife Hospice") and preliminarily denied the other CON applications.

- 4. The Agency published a notice of its preliminary decisions to approve CON 10702 and to deny the remaining co-batched applicants in the Florida Administrative Register. Volume 47, Number 244, p. 5763-66, December 20, 2021.
- 5. Florida Hospice timely filed a petition for formal hearing contesting the Agency's preliminary approval of CON 10702 and the preliminary denial of its CON 10701. Several other denied applicants filed petitions for formal hearing as well.
- 6. The Agency referred the matters to the Division of Administrative Hearings ("DOAH"), where they were consolidated by the Administrative Law Judge.
- 7. On July 1, 2022, Florida Hospice filed a Notice of Voluntary Dismissal of its petition for formal hearing.
- 8. On July 5, 2022, the Administrative Law Judge entered an Order Severing Case and an Amended Order Closing File and Relinquishing Jurisdiction to the Agency with respect to Florida Hospice (DOAH Case No. 22-0274 CON).

It is therefore, **ORDERED**

- 1. The denial of CON 10701 submitted by Florida Hospice is upheld.
- 2. The matter remains open as to the other petitions for formal hearing pending before DOAH.
